Spear was elected to the one-year term at the organization's 90th annual International Convention, held virtually Aug. 23-28.

A Toastmaster since 2000, Spear is a charter member of her home club, <u>AT&T Middletown Toastmasters in Middletown, NJ</u>. She has held several high-profile leadership positions within Toastmasters and has attained the Distinguished Toastmaster designation—the highest level of educational achievement in the organization.



As a member of the Toastmasters International Board of Directors, Spear is a "working ambassador" for the organization. She works with the Board to develop and support the policies and procedures that guide Toastmasters International in fulfilling its mission.

Spear is a software engineer for AT&T in Middletown, New Jersey, and has worked in the telecommunications industry for over 30 years. She has expertise in software development, systems administration, and acceptance testing. She troubleshoots problems and develops software for projects that impact millions of people.

Spear holds a master's degree of science in electrical engineering from the New Jersey Institute of Technology in Newark, New Jersey. She participates in employee



Parliamentarian Perspective!

Toastmasters International is an organization where "leaders are made." Part of that methodology is to build a leadership skill set that will help each member achieve that objective. An important tool is a basic knowledge of parliamentary procedures, a set of rules that guarantees a deliberative assembly the ability to expedite business, maintain order, and ensure justice and equality for all. If the guidelines are followed, the results are courtesy and justice; one order of business at a time; the rule of the majority; and the

rights of the minority.



Toastmasters Clubs in the United States and Canada have adopted Roberts Rules of Order^{NR} (Newly Revised) as its parliamentary authority for all of its deliberative assemblies, and



members should have a working knowledge of its basic principles to use during club-and-above business meetings.

Instruction in basic use of parliamentary law is a goal that District 83 Director Michelle Tropper, DTM has adopted this year, saying "I've always marveled at how smoothly business meetings are run when aided by an adept Parliamentarian. I'm excited that we now have a district committee dedicated to not only helping our meetings run smoother, but also to imparting the knowledge and art of the process to others." To that end she has created a Parliamentary Procedures Committee to carry this out. This team is comprised of Lynda Starr, DTM; Rory Moore, DL3 and I, Jeanette Fredericks, DTM are the foot soldiers in this effort.

Do we as leaders really need a basic knowledge of parliamentary procedures? You bet! Look for workshops and other instructional events throughout the year to bring this important leadership tool to a screen near

you. We promise to make it effective, interesting and fun.
