

## PATHWAYS BASICS

### LEVEL 1

- Ice Breaker – 4-6 min speech\*
- Feedback and Evaluation
  - 5-7 min speech
  - Another 5-7 min speech (recommended to repeat previous speech with same evaluator)
  - Serve as speech evaluator
- Researching and Presenting – 5-7 min speech

\* The Ice Breaker must be completed before the other projects can be accessed. The other Level 1 projects can be done in any order.

### LEVEL 2

- Required Project – Based on path
- Required Project – Based on path
- Introduction to Toastmasters Mentoring – 5-7 min speech

### LEVEL 3

- Required Project – Based on path
- Elective Project – Based on path
- Elective Project – Based on path
- Role Requirements – Member must serve as Evaluator, Table Topics Master and Speech Evaluator before moving on to Level 4. These roles can be done at any time.

### LEVEL 4

- Required Project – Based on path
- Elective Project – Based on path

### LEVEL 5

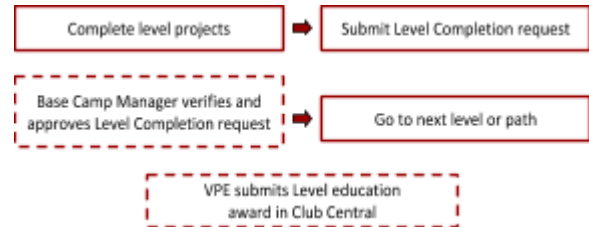
- Required Project – Based on path
- Elective Project – Based on path
- Reflect on Your Path – 10-12 min speech

\* Reflect on Your Path must be completed last. The other Level 5 projects can be done in any order.

#### NOTES:

- In Levels 2, 3, & 4, projects may be done in any order once the level is reached.
- Additional Elective Projects may be completed in levels 3-5, however no credit for them is given in this or subsequent paths.

### PATHWAYS MENTORING PROGRAM

- Introduction to Toastmasters Mentoring – 5-7 min speech
  - This project is in Level 2 of every Path. Member can then request remaining optional Mentoring Program projects in Suggested Education section in Base Camp and can complete them at any time.
- Prepare to Mentor – Complete self-evaluation
- Mentoring
  - Mentor someone for short-term project
  - 5-7 min speech
- Advanced Mentoring
  - Mentor someone for a long-term period
  - 5-7 min speech

### DISTINGUISHED TOASTMASTER (DTM)

Requirements to earn DTM Designation in Pathways:

- Complete two learning paths.
- Serve as a club officer for 12 months and participate in a district-sponsored club officer training program. (If your club has six-month terms for officers, you can fulfill this requirement by serving as a club officer twice, but you don't have to do it in consecutive terms.)
- Serve a complete one-year term as a district officer.
- Serve successfully as a club mentor or coach.
- Serve successfully as a club sponsor or conduct a Speechcraft or Youth Leadership program.
- Complete the DTM project. (Members are required to create and implement a project of their own design, in which they demonstrate the skills and expertise they have gained.)
